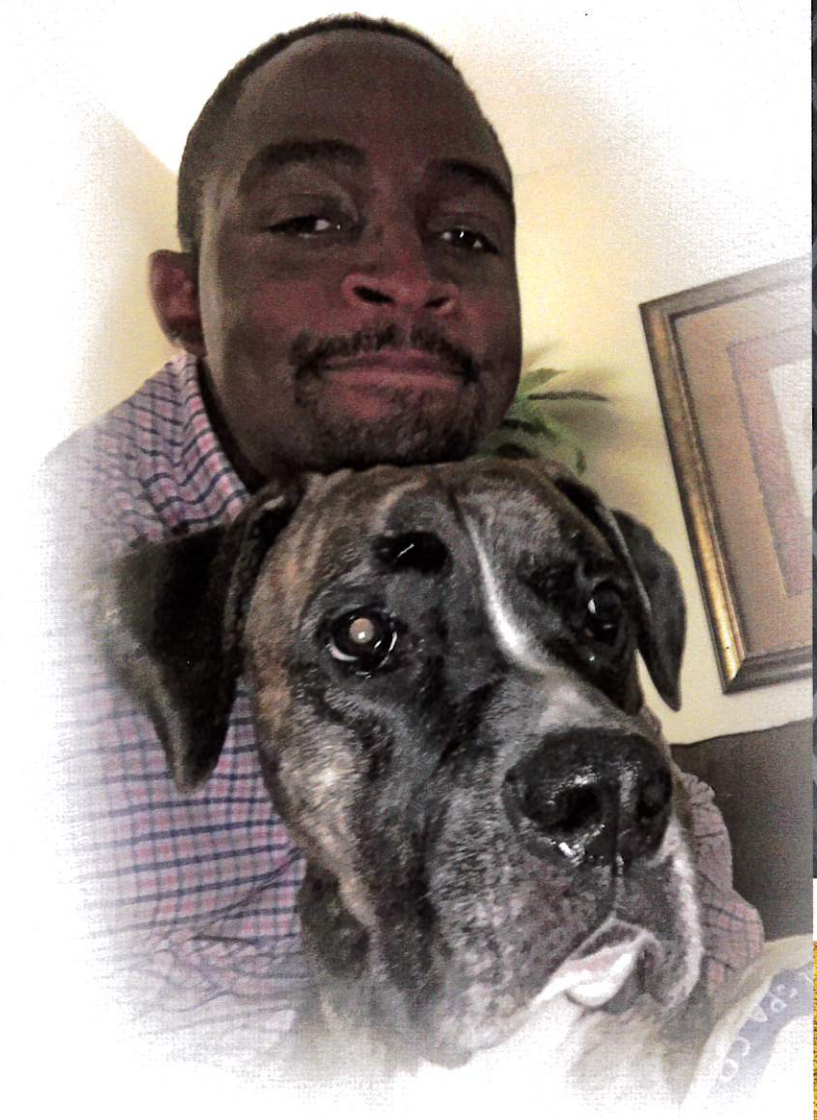
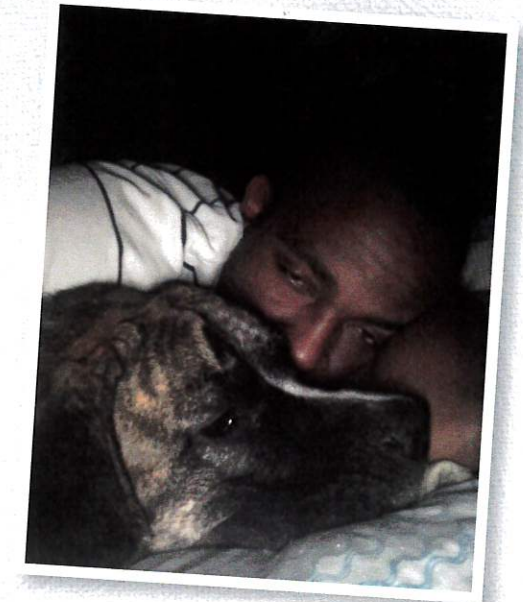


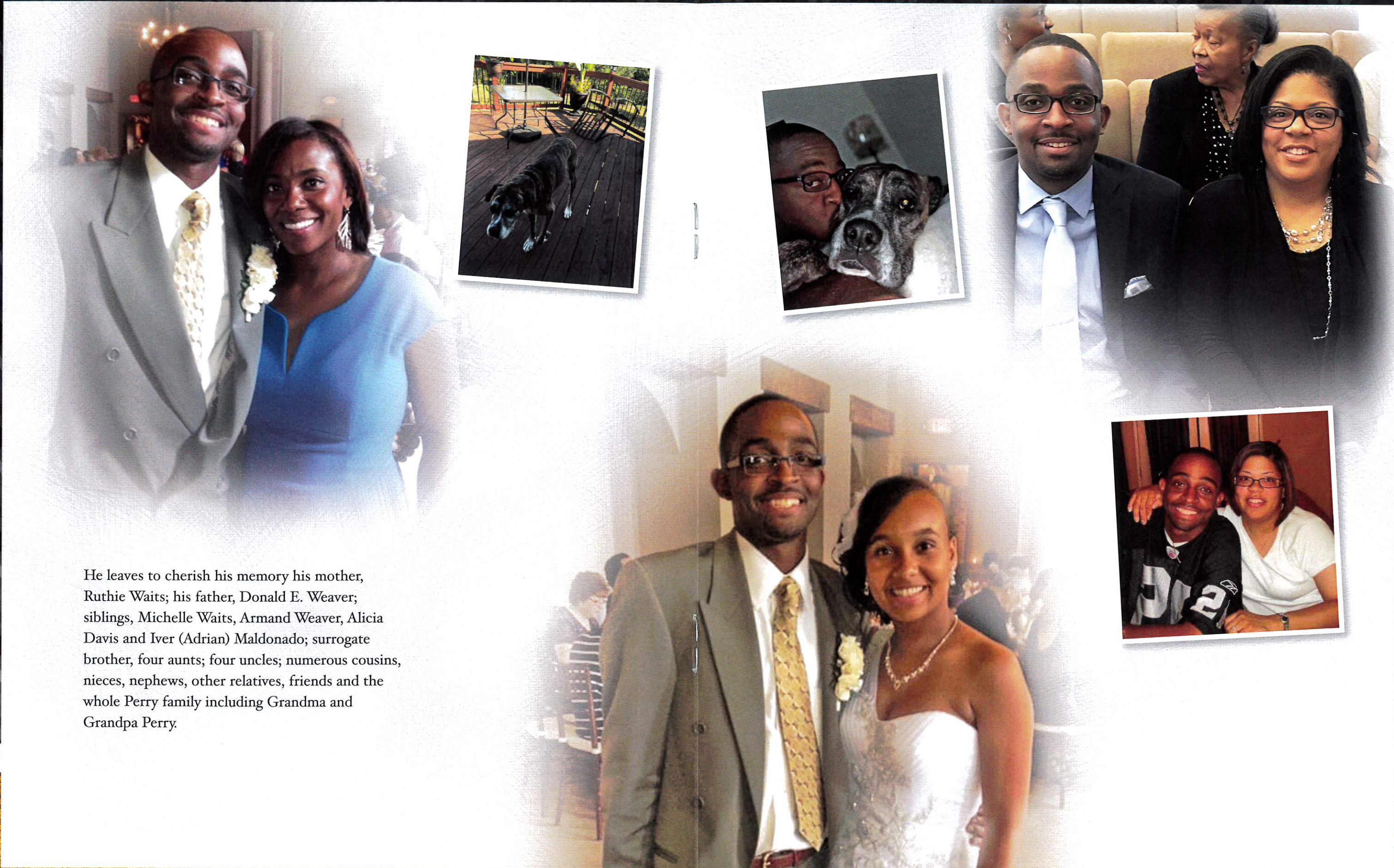
Chris spent his last five years employed with Sandberg Phoenix & Von Gontard P. C. Law Firm, as a systems analyst.

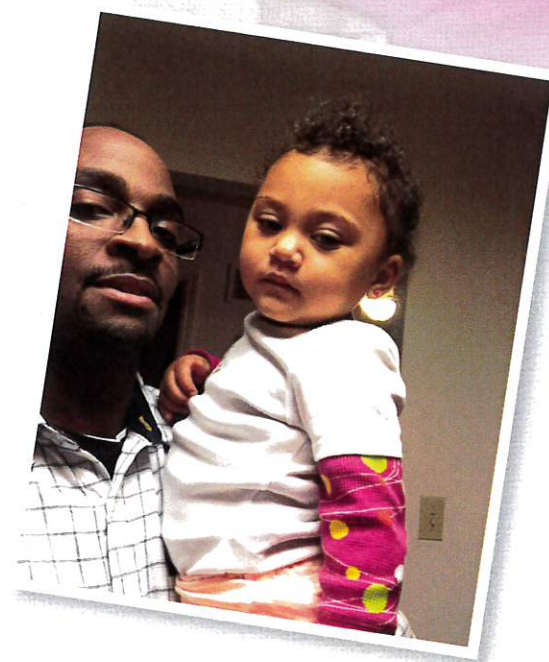
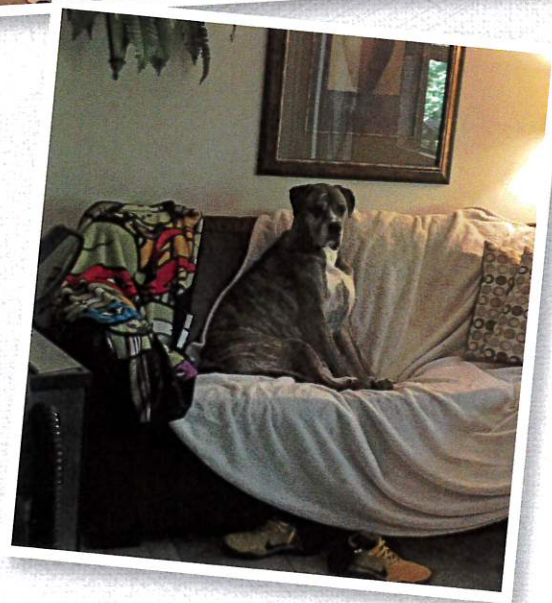

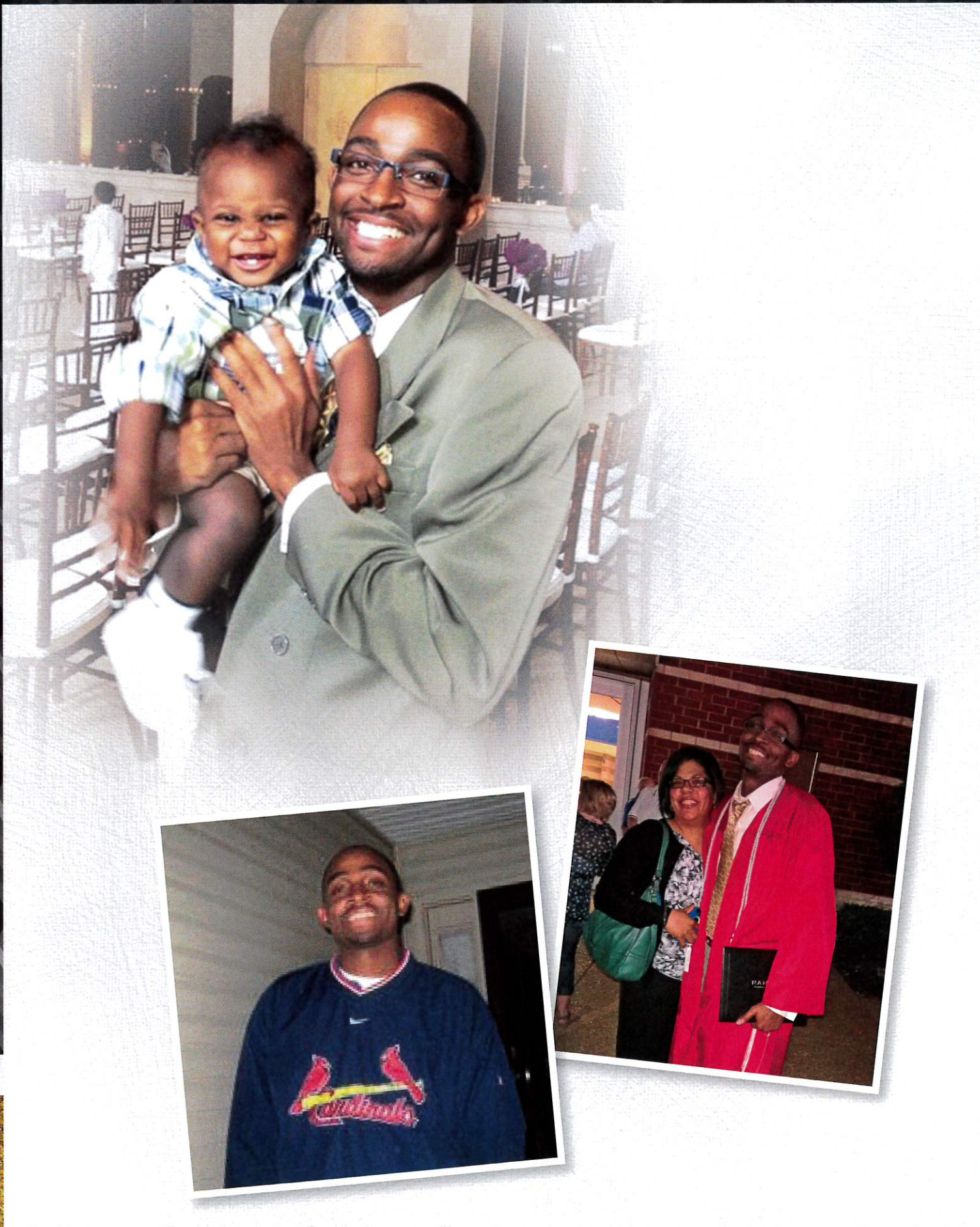
A TRIBUTE
